Or Hockey Manitoba (as it is called today)

The first meeting of The Manitoba Amateur Hockey Association was held on June 22, 1914, with the following present: Dr. W. F. Taylor, M. Skinner, J. McGillivray – Kenora, F. P. Marples, J. D. Pratt and J. Davidson.

The name of the organization was adopted on a motion of Claude Robinson with seconder J. Davidson at a meeting on December 20, 1914. The constitution and by-laws were drawn up by a committee consisting of D. W. F. Nichols, J. Davidson and C. Robinson. The first officers were:

Honorary President – W. Northey - Montreal

President – Dr. W. F. Taylor

First Vice-President – J. McGillivray – Kenora

Second Vice-President – M. Skinner

Secretary/Treasurer – F. P. Marples
